Infants and young children remind us daily that creation lives among us. It wasn't so long ago that these young children arrived in the world. You thought, felt, or said something like "It is good" when first meeting your child. In these stressful times, let us remember those first moments with our child and say once again, "You are good" to your child.

Bible Words: "God saw everything that he had made, and indeed, it was very good." Genesis 1:31

Bible Story: (Read the story below to your child or from your favorite Bible story book.)

Creation – From Genesis 1 and the Frolic First Bible (pages 2-3)

Day 1: In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. It was dark and empty. God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. God called the light day and the darkness night. God said, "It is good."

"God made the earth, sky and sea. God made the sun, moon, and stars. God filled the earth with plants and animals. Then God made people. "Care for my creation!" God told them. At the end of each day, God said, "It is good." And then God rested."

Prayer: (pray with your child)

Dear God, thank you for creating the light and darkness. Thank you for animals, plants, and people. Thank you for creating me too! Amen.

Activities to do with your child:

Action Rhyme

God said, let there be light. *Place hand over eyes. Remove hands to see the light, as in Peek-a-boo.*

God made the earth, sky and sea, *For earth, begin with rounded arms above head. For sky, open arms up with hands open to the sky. For sea, make waves with hands across the horizon.*

God made you and God made me! *For you, point out with both hands toward another person. For me, point at yourself, using both thumbs.*

Song *Sing to the tune of "Frere Jacques."*

It was good, It was good.

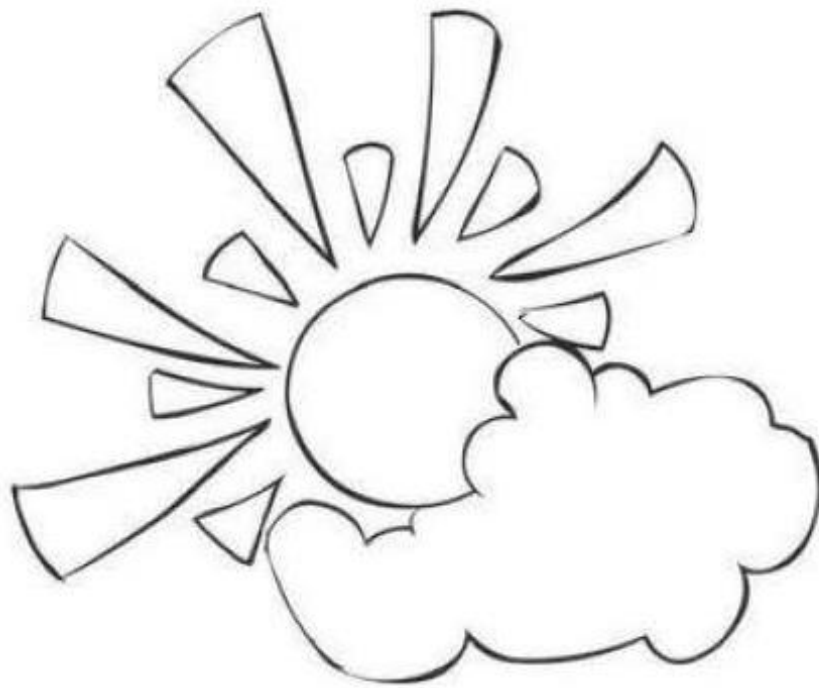
Night and Day

Supplies: black construction paper, yellow construction paper, glue stick

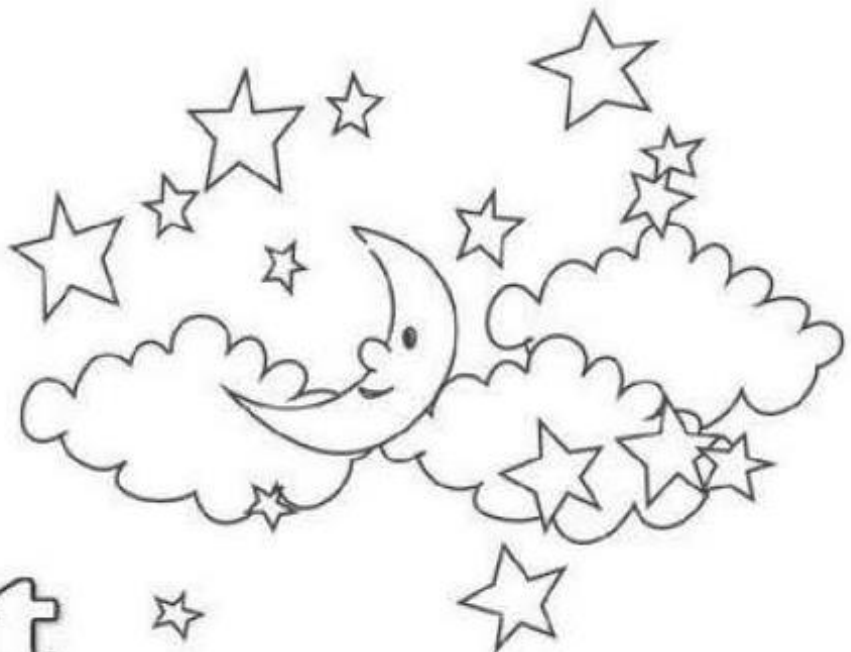
Do: Fold the black paper in half to make a book. Glue the yellow paper inside. When you are finished, close the book and say, "God said, let there be light." Open the book to see the light.
